

When and where can I apply?

Generally registration takes place:

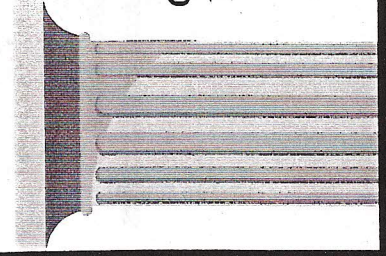
- * Beginning of September for the Fall Courses offered through Queensborough Community College.
- * Beginning of December for the Spring Course offered through Queensborough Community College.
- * During March and beginning of April for the Summer Course offered through Queens College or Queensborough Community College.
- * During April for the Fall Courses offered at Queens College.

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College Now Mission:

College Now is a free program designed to prepare New York City's public high school students for college.

The Queens High School of Teaching collaborates with Queens College and Queensborough Community College, City University of New York (CUNY) to offer students a variety of classes each semester.

The program then offers eligible students a number of ways to improve their high school performance and get a jumpstart on college.

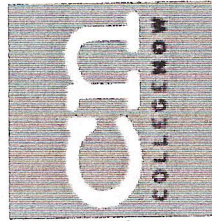
College Now offers many activities and opportunities:

- * academic courses (both for high school and college credit)
- * campus-based tours and cultural events, such as theater or dance performances
- * exclusive scholarship offers

Who Can Participate?

Most College Now students are in the 11th or 12th grade, but more and more courses and events are available for 9th and 10th graders. Each semester we try to offer a variety of courses with different eligibility requirements.

Please note that specific College Now activities may have additional requirements. To take a college-credit class, for example, you'll need to meet course-enrollment requirements. For example, if a student wanted to take English 101 - the student would have had to taken the English Regents Exam and scored a 75 or higher.

Courses???

A variety of courses are offered in collaboration with Queens College and Queensborough Community College. The selection of courses available each semester depends upon several factors, mainly budget and student interest.

Classes offered in collaboration with Queens College are held at Queens College during the weekday or weekend. Courses are available during the Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters. In the Fall and Spring semesters, students have a menu of about twenty different classes to choose from. Each class has its' own specific requirements. In the Summer, the College runs a Humanities Program and Summer Science Program (pending funding).

Classes offered in collaboration with Queensborough Community College are held on Saturdays at The Queens High School of Teaching, with only QHST students, during the regular academic year and at their campus during the summer. Courses vary from semester to semester. For example we are offering Psychology 101 and a Writing Course which helps with the SAT.
